## Dual Enrollment



Thirty-six qualified high school students from nineteen area high schools and thirty home school students enrolled for the fall 2017 semester in individual dual enrollment courses. Seven students were funded by the Commonwealth Dual Enrollment program (free course) and fifty-nine students received the reduced rate through the Massasoit Dual Enrollment program. The Participating high schools include: BC High, Braintree, Brockton, Canton, Chamberlain School, Fontbonne, Foxboro, East Bridgewater, Hanover, Middleboro, Norfolk Agricultural, Norwood, Old Colony, Rockland, Southeastern, South Shore Charter, Taunton, and West Bridgewater. Students registered for a variety of courses including Mathematics, Sciences, and Social Sciences.

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## The Commonwealth Honors Program



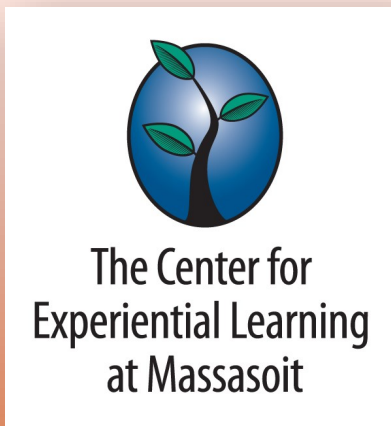

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## Students can Extend their Learning to Outside the Classroom

Students enrolled at Massasoit Community College are encouraged to round out their academic experience by completing at least one internship alongside their degree or certificate. While some academic programs require an internship or field experience as a graduation requirement, all students have the option of completing a non-credit internship to gain professional experience. Massasoit's Internship Coordinator helps students find and apply for internships and supports students during the internship semester. Students may register for a non-credit internship seminar that is recorded on their official college transcript. The seminar guides students through reflections on the value of the internship and provides students with professional evaluations and feedback. Recent internship hosts include Massasoit, the Middleboro Town Offices, BAMSI, and the Brockton Housing Authority.
