Verb Tense: Future



Simple Future [will + infinitive without "to"]

Use when stating: Example:

Actions/situations that are highly expected to happen in the future	She will talk to you when she finds out you broke her chair! You will see the building if you continue on this street.
<u>Promises/plans</u>	I will get back to you when I find more information. The president says he will solve America's healthcare is-

Future Continuous [will + be + gerund (Verb + ing)]

Use when stating: Example:

Actions/situations that will be continued at certain points in the future

They **will be playing** tennis by the time she gets to the park.

Irene **will be cruising** around the Caribbean islands this time next week.

Future Perfect [will + have + Past participle (Verb + d/ed)]

Use when stating: Example:

Actions/situations that will be finished at certain points in the future Genie will have graduated from a university with a teaching diploma by the time her sister gets into a high school.

My parents will have retired when I am 20.

Future Perfect Continuous> [will + have + been + gerund (Verb + ing]

Use when stating: Example:

Actions/situations that will be continued at certain points in the future

Jessica will **have been studying** Spanish for 5 years this time next year.
