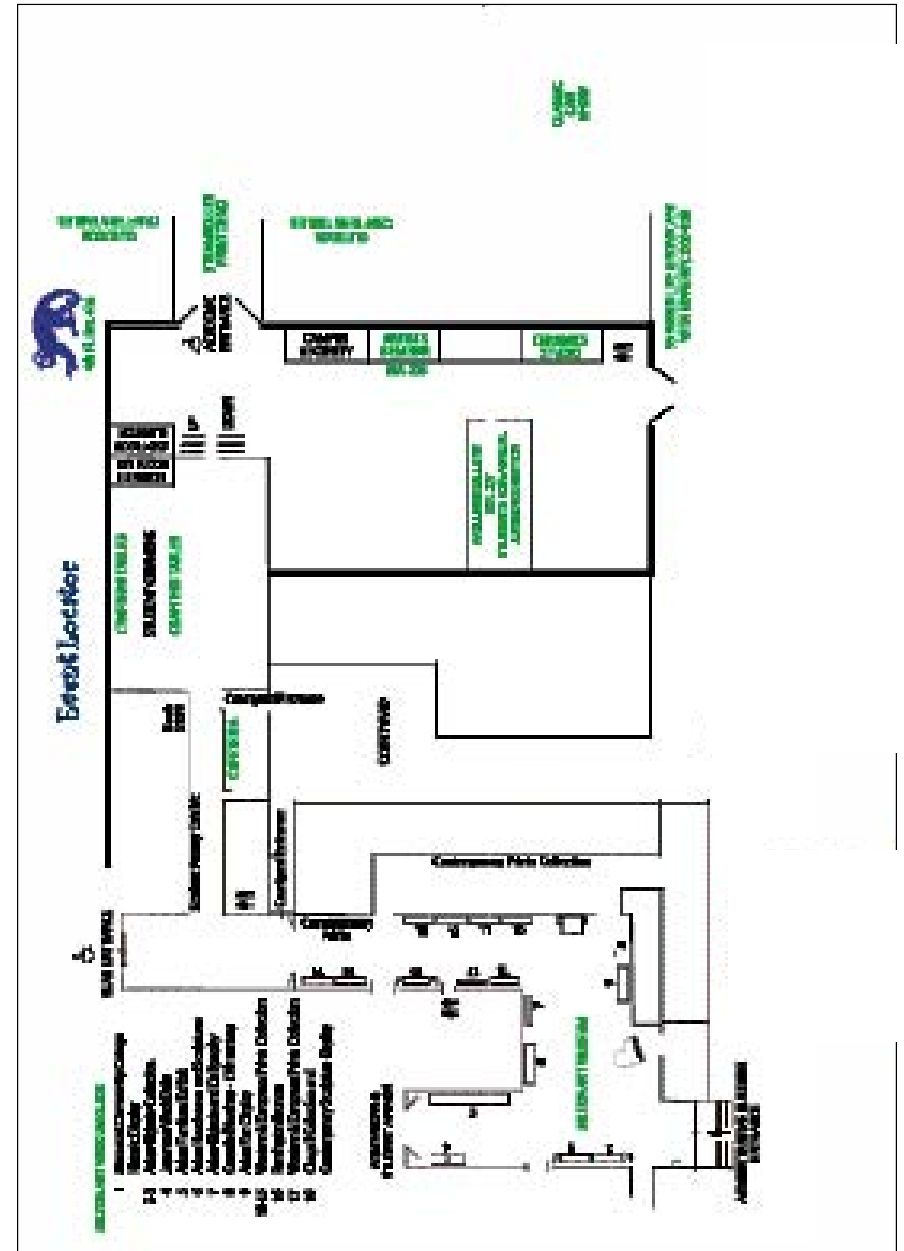

The 7th Arches Student Print Exhibition

The Visual Arts department is pleased to announce that Kelliann Jarasitis received the Arches Paper Award at the juried 7th Arches Student Print Exhibition for her monotype portrait titled "Pumpkin Bowl". This student exhibition will be shown in conjunction with the Boston Printmakers' North American Print Biennial from February 27-May 1, 2011 at the Danforth Museum, Framingham, MA. Printmaking students from twenty-one New England art schools, colleges and universities submitted their best work to this prestigious juried exhibition sponsored by the Arches Paper Company. This is the first time Massasoit Community College students have participated in the Arches Student Print Exhibition. Fourteen prints by eleven student printmakers were juried into the show. They will be hosting a silkscreen event at the upcoming Sensation Day at the Fuller Craft Museum on February 21st and will have a number of free printmaking events at this year's 3rd Annual Arts Festival on Sunday, May 22nd. Kelliann, a future June 2011 fine arts graduate of the Visual Arts program, recently won the Arches Paper Award for her outstanding monotype print at the 7th Arches Student Print Show at the Danforth Museum in Framingham. 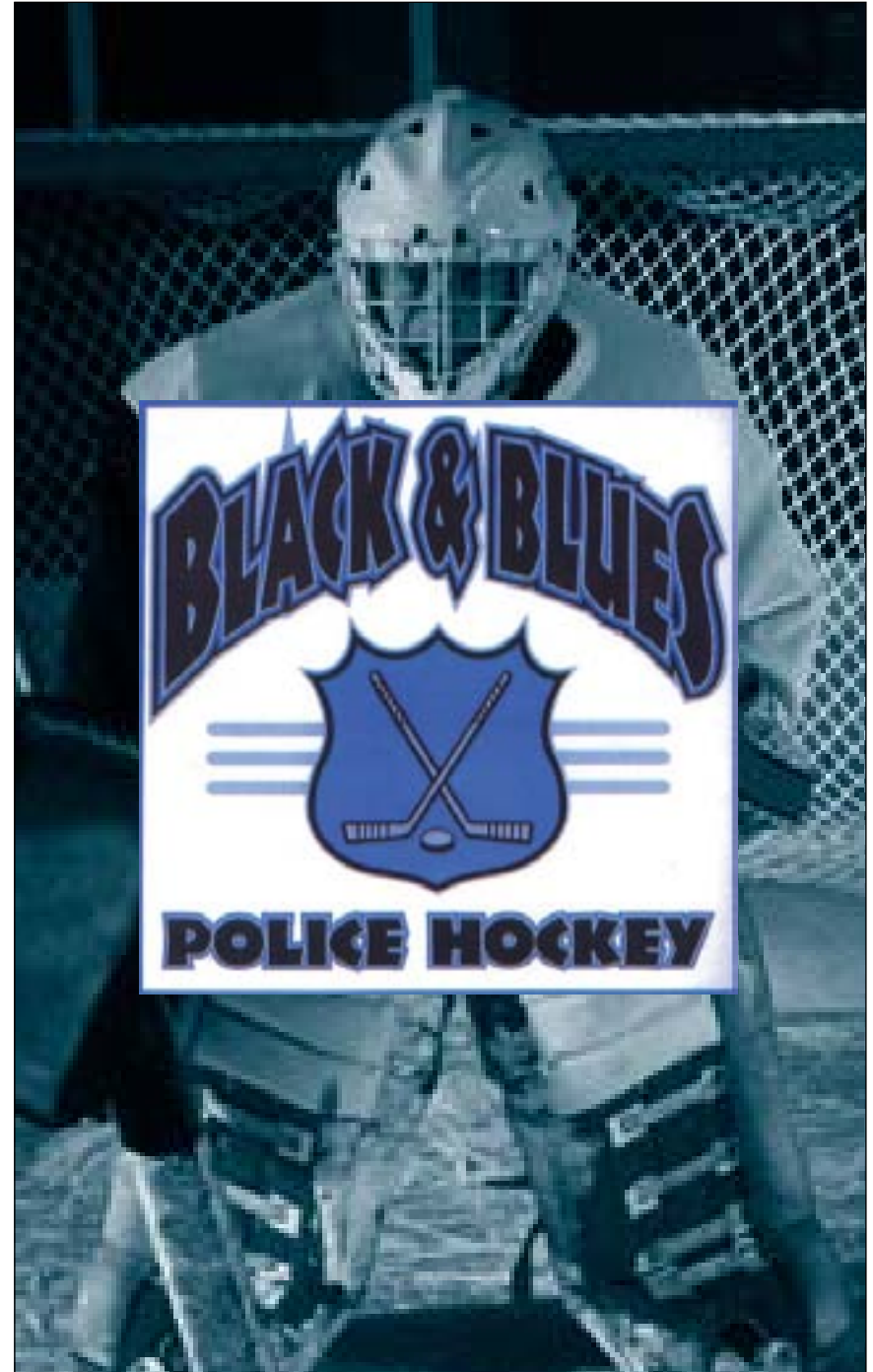

The Milton Art Museum



The Milton Art Museum was established as a non-profit organization in 1986 for the benefit of the public school children of Milton. In the past 20 years, its mission has broadened to include private and parochial schools, college students, & families in South Shore communities. The museum was originally located on the top floor of the Cunningham Elementary School in Milton, MA. The permanent art collection and education programs remained there until 2003, when the building closed for major renovation. The Milton Art Museum Board of Trustees was then faced with the challenge of finding space that could accommodate its operations. After a long search for new space with no positive results, the Board then faced the prospect of storing the collection and closing the museum. Fortunately, an offer to house the Museum at Massasoit Community College, a Massachusetts public college, was received and happily accepted. In the summer of 2003 the Milton Art Museum became an art-collection-in-residence at the college's Canton campus. The Milton Art Museum continues its education programs in Milton and surrounding towns.

The collection is displayed in its own handsomely crafted Asian-style cherry cabinets, and installed on the walls in and around the lobby of college's Administration Wing, where the baby grand piano resides as well. The fountain and statuary are displayed in the courtyard. The museum is open to the public free of charge during college hours. Self-Guided Tour brochures are available to assist visitors as

they enter the building.

The Asian Collection displays examples of original art, prints, sculptures, objects, dolls, fans, furniture and a Samurai Armor, spanning many time periods and Asian cultures. Spectacular Thai headdresses, Bhuddahs, Sume-i paintings, Washi Dolls, and Chinese, Korean, and Japanese calligraphy are displayed.

The collection of Frederick Remington and Charles Russell cast bronzes are treasures of 19th century American western art. European and American etchings and lithographs span the 18th to the 21st centuries, and includes works by Piranesi, Turner, Renoir, Picasso, Chagall, Miro, Cezanne, Kollwitz, Whistler, Signac, and others. The collection of modern signed prints includes Warhol, Magritte, Miro, Calder, Motherwell, Baskin, Hundertwasser, Lebadang and other Boston area print makers.

The centerpiece of the museum's art collection is a 17th century oil painting by the Dutch painter Cornelius Bisschop, entitled "Mother und Kind," still nestled in its original gold gilt frame.

The Milton Art Museum provides access as a teaching resource for Massasoit Community College and offers an enriching experience to all who visit.
