

Professor Charles Mastrangelo is of 30 nationwide to receive the International Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society 2014 Distinguished Advisor Award.

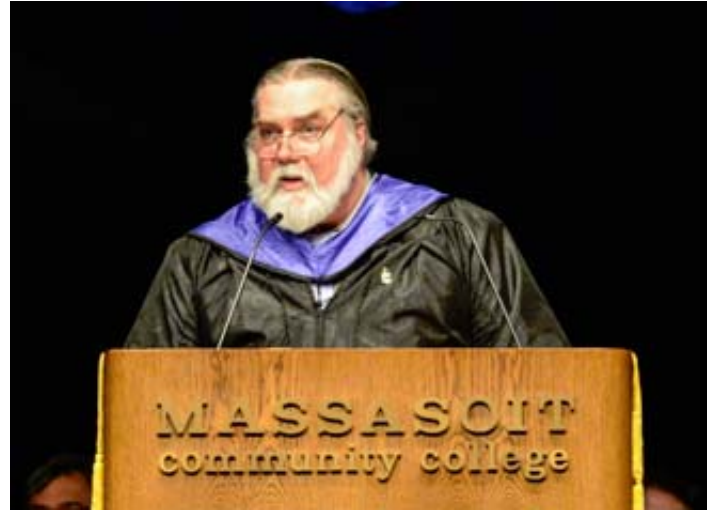
